The Role of Funeral Operative

# A typical day in the life of a Funeral Operative

8.45am	Start work at Bishop's Stortford office. Clean hearse and limousine ready for the day's funerals
10.30am	Receive floral tributes from florist for today's funeral. Assist Funeral Director in checking the deceased and closing down the coffin. Help to load coffin onto hearse followed by the floral tributes.
11.00am	Change into funeral clothing, ensure shoes are clean and polished. Have a quick bite to eat (mealtimes can be very erratic!)
11.15am	Drive limousine to funeral. Collect family en-route. Carry coffin into Chapel for the funeral. Help to display the flowers out side for the family to view after the service. Return the family home in the limousine after the service.
12.45pm	Back at the funeral home, clean the vehicles again.
2.00pm	Collect a deceased from Addenbrooke's Hospital and bring into our care.
3.00pm	Prepare coffins and plates as required.
4.00pm	Begin to dress and prepare the deceased in accordance with the family's wishes.
4.15pm	I am required to attend an Essex Coroner's removal from Stansted. The family are at the address so we are not able to remove the deceased immediately. The police ask us to talk to the family about what happens next.
5.30pm	Return to funeral home. Finish dressing and preparing the deceased ready for viewing the following day.
6.00pm	Go home and wait for the phone to ring as I am on call tonight.
